Accelerated Career Training Teaching Skills for Work and Life

The GIENC® Accelerated Career Training (ACT) Program is a comprehensive career development program for adults and families.

Programming is available through partner organizations in a variety of formats in order to address the diverse needs of the community served by GIENC. Through workshops, programs, and clinics, the ACT program focuses on meeting members of the community where they are, helping individuals build skills to attain and maintain competitive employment.



On January 6, 2023, GIENC was issued accreditation from the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF) for the Accelerated Career Training Program based on a survey conducted in November. The three-year accreditation was issued in the category of Employee Development Services. As their highest level of accreditation, CARF describes the achievement as, "an indication of [the] organization's dedication and commitment to improving the quality of the lives of the persons served."

WHEN TYWANDA WALKER decided to enroll in the Accelerated Career Training Program, she was a new business owner. She was running her own pet boutique, Adorable Pets, a shop that sold dog clothes, shoes, and accessories.

Tywanda had a strong network of mentors that helped her develop a business plan and complete legal paperwork to establish her LLC., but it was important to her that she continued learning so she could continue to run a successful business.

She created her own goals to work on skills like time management, planning ahead, and decision making. She said that, even though she wasn't looking for a new job like some of the other participants in her cohort, the program gave her the opportunity to learn skills that she has found valuable as she continues to run her shop.

Today, Adorable Pets is flourishing on Etsy. Tywanda says that, while being an entrepreneur can be challenging, it's a dream that anyone can achieve if they find a good network of mentors and work hard.


Today, if you visit A Place at the Table, it looks a lot like any other restaurant, but when you get to the register, things are a little different. Each menu item has a suggested price, but you can also pay for your meal by paying what you can or volunteering in the cafe. Anyone who walks through the door has access to a high-quality meal, and over 60,000 of these meals have been served over the past five years.

Table has quickly become a cornerstone of the downtown Raleigh community. Founder and Executive Director Maggie Kane attributes the organization's success to the community itself. GIENC has partnered with A Place at the Table for the past 2 years. We are proud to support organizations like Maggie's that honor the dignity of the individuals they serve.
